

Every day, seven young people aged 13-24 hear the words *"you have cancer"

They will each need specialised nursing care and support to get them through it. Teenage Cancer Trust is the only UK charity dedicated to meeting this vital need - no young person should have to face cancer alone.

You only get one chance at being young, and those few crucial years will shape the person you become. Cancer can throw all of that off track. Suddenly, your life's been turned upside * down, you're scared and you're living from one appointment to the next. In an instant, life becomes an endurance test of diagnoses, check-ups and treatments and for many young patients, this is their first major experience of ill-health.

TCT makes sure young people have someone in their corner right from the start. Their nurses and youth workers support young people through every step of their treatment, and for up to two years afterwards, so that they can recover and live life to the fullest. They run events for young people with cancer to help them regain independence and meet other young people going through something similar.

Without TCT, the lives of young people with cancer would be even harder.





HISTORY OF REVEAL

"When I was younger, my sister was diagnosed with leukaemia. She spent the best part of a year in hospital, and back then it was so far from what the units are like now.

The year I started the show it was going to be her 30th birthday, I decided that I wanted to raise money for a charity, but I wanted to do something fun that lots of people would enjoy. I had been to Bristol a few times to see my brother in their medic strip show and it was always such a fun night. I decided to do a similar format in Edinburgh but didn't want it to be about your talent as a dancer or having a conventional body type. I wanted it to be something anyone could get involved with and enjoy.

I didn't really talk much about this when I started.

But on the last year of myself running it, I got so drunk I said in my speech, "This is for anyone that's ever had to go through chemo in a shithole" – mortifying.

But, I guess it kind of is.

I told all my friends why I was doing it and essentially told them they had no choice but to be in it. Honestly, I was expecting there to be like 20 people in it and a couple of hundred seeing it. I got my pals to help as coordinators and then we made a Facebook page and it got 1000 likes in 2 days so we realised it might be bigger than we'd thought".

A MESSAGE FROM WELLBEING

Performing onstage can be a nerve-wracking experience - especially in your underwear. Ensuring every cast member feels safe and supported throughout rehearsals and on the night is key to Reveal.

This year, Reveal has strived to promote wellbeing and increase inclusivity through maximising the support available to cast members and educating committee and choreographers. Cast commitments ensure that all cast members are comfortable and aware of what encompasses being a member of Reveal cast - from fundraising to rehearsal attendance.

Alongside these commitments, 'Wellbeing Reps' have been implemented for each strip level. These Reps act as points of contact for cast members to support them in balancing Reveal commitments throughout the year and to enjoy the Reveal experience to the fullest extent.

Additionally, we encourage cast members to act in a way that reflects Reveal's principles of wellbeing and body inclusivity. A cast code of conduct and an available anonymous complaints form aims to protect and support all cast, members. These resources act to empower cast members to raise concerns and to ensure a no-tolerance policy around negativity surrounding body image and discrimination.

Finally, we are proud to have increased our collaboration with Edinburgh University Medics' LGBTQ+ society to learn how to better support our queer community. This has resulted in educational talks and posts on drag and gender expression for committee, choreographers and cast, and we have also worked on making all dances a welcoming space for non-binary and trans people.

We also collaborated with BAME Medics to educate our cast *members on fake-tanning and the impact that it can have. We can't wait to continue collaborating with these great societies in the coming years; while we recognise we are not the whole way there we are excited to continue learning how to be more inclusive and to ensure that Reveal maintains a safe and supportive environment.
